Paid members can expect to receive new membership, spouse identification, and key cards in the mail beginning in late February. POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



On March 11, 1898, B.P.O.E. No. 410, received its charter. It was the largest Elks club in the state, an honor it holds to this day. Originally the Madison Elks met at a hotel, but quickly began making plans for its own clubhouse. Located at the corner of Monona Avenue (now Martin Luther King, *Ir.*, Boulevard) and Doty Street the cornerstone was laid at 11 p.m. on October 27, 1901. The members moved into their new home designed by Madison architects Claude and Starck in May of 1920. The then state-of-the-art facility on the first floor included a parlor, library, card and billiards rooms, café and bar. The commodious Lodge hall on the second floor was also used for balls and theatrical performance. The basement included five bowling alleys. The building remained largely unchanged until 1950 when the membership approved \$88,000 for refurbishment. By the early 60s the facility was too small for its 1,500 members, had air conditioning only in the bar and restaurant, and no onsite parking. After finding a suitable location plans for a new Lodge on Jenifer Street began. In 1965 Madison Lodge 410 moved to its current location. The original structure was soon after razed to make way for an extension of the Bank of Madison's parking lot. Today the Risser Justice Center occupies the location.

NORMAN "NORM J. SALT



1923 - 2014 Exalter Ruler 1980 - 1981

Norman James Salt was born on January 19, 1923 in Trent-on-Stoke, England, the son of James Salt, Jr., and Theresa Thirza Hancock. In 1926 the family immigrated to the United State and settled in Elizabeth, New Jersey, where Norman grew up. He graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School there and joined the U.S. Navy. During World War II he served in the Naval Transport Service. During that time, he met his future wife, Jean Marie Stewart, who was a nurse in the U.S. Navy. They would marry on November 5, 1943. The couple had three children, a son and two daughters.

Norm would eventually make Madison his home, first coming here to attend the Radio Code School at the University of Wisconsin. He was president of the Metropolitan Business Association, board member of both the Arthritis Foundation and Easter Seals of Wisconsin, and director of the Charitable, Educational, and Scientific Foundation of the State Medical Society of Wisconsin. Mr. Salt was employed as the office manager for WPS (Wisconsin Physicians Service). A life member of Madison Elks 410, he served as Exalted Ruler between 1980 and 1981.

Norman J. Salt's mantra was "remember the good times." He died on September 12, 2014 and is buried with his wife who preceded him in death in Forrest Hill Cemetery.






