#### **MEMBERSHIP MATTERS**

As one year begins, another draws to a close. In Elkdom we have begun to prepare for our new fiscal year that begins April 1, 2025. This means you will be receiving your dues statement for next year in the mail this month. Once you receive it, we hope you will send us a check in the reply envelope enclosed or pay with a credit card using the link printed on the statement.

Beside your mandatory dues (local, state and national assessments), each year the statement offers you a way to make optional donations. The optional amounts listed are suggested donations, but we welcome your contribution of any amount! Please note that donations made to the Wisconsin Benevolent Fund (providing aid to the sick, disabled, youth, and unfortunate), State Major Project (Camp Wawbeek Easter Seals Respite Camp), Elks National Foundation, and Madison Charities are all tax deductible contributions.

Paid members can expect to receive new membership, spouse identification, and key card starting in mid-February. However, your new key cards will not be activated until after April 1st so continue use your current green key cards until then. Identification cards to widows and widowers will be mailed in early March. Don't forget to sign your membership and identifications cards.

Election of new officers will take place at the February 26 membership meetings. Members in good standing can be nominated at the January 8 and February 12 meetings.

#### POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



Reno Lodge #597 chartered in 1900, dedicated its new clubhouse on April 23, 1904. Located at 50 North Sierra Street, the new building had the appearance of a grand private residence. Through the entry portico and main glass and mahogany doors, a grand central hall opened to large reception rooms on either side. A great stairway led upstairs to the spacious lodge room, finished throughout in mahogany with fine carpets.

Between 1904 and 1957 the Reno Elks Home was flooded twice by the Truckee River and also survived a small fire. On February 5, 1957, however, the luck of the building ran out when the edifice was destroyed by a disastrous explosion on Sierra Street that set the building and many neighboring structures on fire. Seventy-four members had to be evacuated from the lunch and card rooms. Only minor injuries were reported among the Elks, although the building had to be razed soon after.



1909 -2000 Exalted Ruler 1965-1966


#### **ALBERT "AL" KOCH**

Albert Earl "Al" Koch was born on May 7, 1909, in Richland County, Wisconsin, the son of William Earl Koch and Winnie Eliza Button. He was raised on a farm in Buena Vista Township established by his pioneer great-grandparents. Al attended the University of Wisconsin and graduated from the law school in 1942. Upon completion of his service in the U.S. Army during World War II, he returned to Madison to practice law. In 1952 he married Florence Agnes Piazzi.

Albert, a Lifetime Member of the Madison Elks Lodge, was the first to serve as Exalted Ruler at the Jenifer Street location that opened in April of 1965. During his one-year term the new building was broken into twice. The first burglary occurred on August 3 when the robbers made off with \$1,300 in cash. The second happened only five days later. Unsuccessfully able to break into the safe, they left empty-handed. That safe is still in use today and has quite a colorful history. With great effort it was brought over from the original clubhouse downtown. In 1983 robbers stole the entire safe which was later

found empty along Highway 151 between Verona and Mount Horeb.

Albert Koch's first love was always the family farm to which he resided on for most of his life. He was also the owner of the Bank of Lone Rock, a Richland County Supervisor, and a member of the American Legion. Albert and Florence Koch left a bequest to the University of Wisconsin that endowed the ophthalmology research fund that bears their name. He died in Spring Green on February 7, 2000, and is buried with his wife who preceded him in death in the Button family cemetery in Buena Vista Township.




