## POSTCARD FROM THE PAST



*“The new Elks Club Lodge clubhouse is ready to open on Lake Monona at 711 Jenifer Street” was the photo caption for an article published in the Wisconsin State Journal on March 15, 1965. Members occupied the upper level in early April, but the lower level was not finished until several months later. The balcony across the back of the building was enclosed in the 1980s to enlarge the dining room, bar and ballroom downstairs. The original plans included a flagstone terrace along the lakeshore but it was never constructed.*

## WILLIAM F. BONGARD



1928 – 2000

Exalted Ruler

1988-1989

William “Bill” Frank Bongard was born in Madison on August 21, 1928, the son of Eugene William Bongard and Regina Ring. He was the grandson of German immigrants who in 1847 settled in what would become Sauk County. Bill attended St. James Grade School and West High School. Upon graduation, he got his first job at the Forsberg Paper Box Company. On February 26, 1946, he married his childhood sweetheart, Marian Elizabeth Palmer. For more than 37 years, William Bongard worked for the City of Madison Streets Department as a heavy equipment operator and was vice president of City Employees Local Union 236.

Bill was active in his church, St. James Catholic Church, and a member of Catholic Order of Foresters, St. Mary’s Hospital Auxiliary and other civic organizations. On December 12, 1980, he was initiated into the B.P.O.E. at Madison Lodge 410. From 1988 until 1989 William Bongard served as Exalted Ruler. His brother Robert and sons Alan and Michael were also members of our Lodge.

William Bongard died on January 24, 2000, and is buried in Resurrection Cemetery with his wife of 54 years, Marian, who died in 2001.

# ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION NEWS

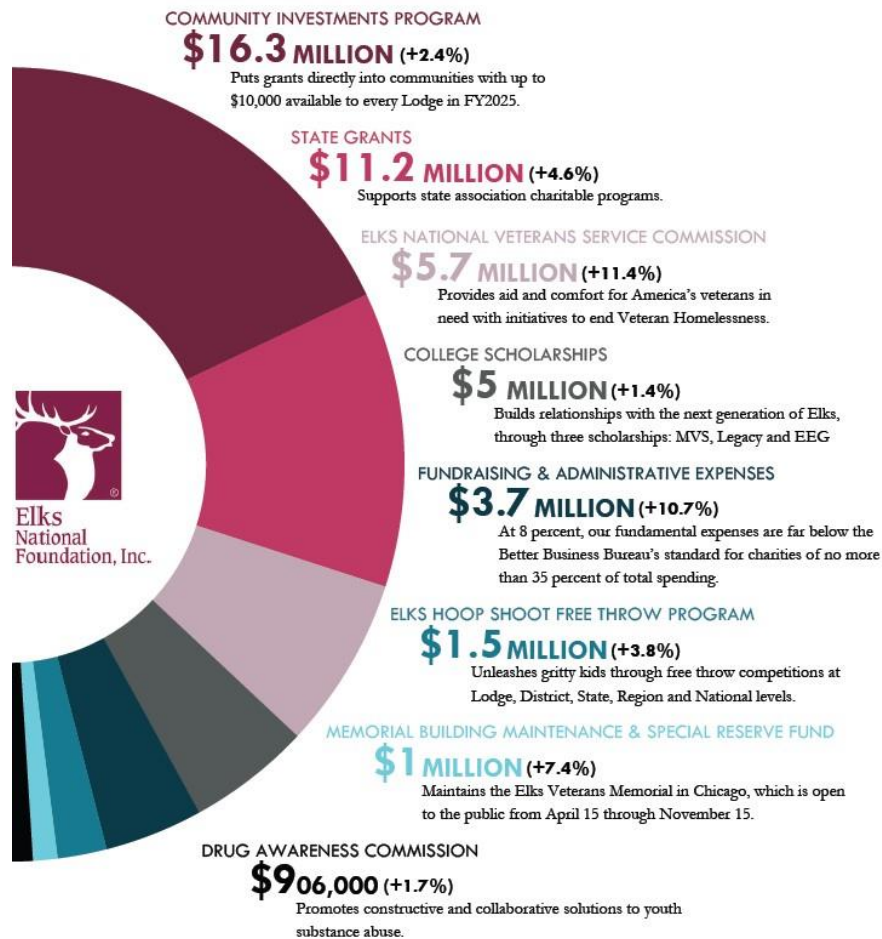

As Chairperson of the Elks National Foundation for our Lodge, it is my responsibility to make our members aware of what your generous donations are doing in our community. Each year you are asked to make additional contributions when you pay your dues and ENF is one of the options. For every dollar donated to ENF, \$4 goes back to the state and local Lodges to support their community projects. Thanks to ENF, the Elks is second only to the federal government in the amount of college scholarships awarded to students.

Donations to ENF are tax deductible! One of the easiest ways to donate to ENF is through the Fidelity Club that is a monthly autopay donation that can be made with your credit card or bank account for as little as \$5 per month. You can sign up to be a member of the Fidelity Club via the [elks.org](http://elks.org) website or find me at the Lodge and I'd be happy to help!

The funds that we donate to ENF continue to come back to our Lodge as grant funds that we give back to our community. ENF has awarded \$64,500 in grants to the Madison Elks Lodge 410 over the past five years to these recipients that support our Veterans and our community: Wil-Mar Neighborhood Center, The Rainbow Project, Common Threads, East Madison Community Center, Madison Reading Project, Centro Hispano, Design for a Difference, Porchlight, Stand Down Madison, Badger Honor Flight, Custom Canines, U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Madison College and the Salvation Army.

Last month I was presented with an award for the second highest "ENF Chair Challenge" score in the state for the donations made by the Madison Lodge this past year. The Challenge is based on membership participation, donations, and leadership contributions. We would love to come in first place this year but will need your help. If every member would contribute just \$5 this year to ENF, or sign up for a monthly contribution of \$5 per month through the Fidelity Club, it will put us over the top and exceed our giving goal for 2025! 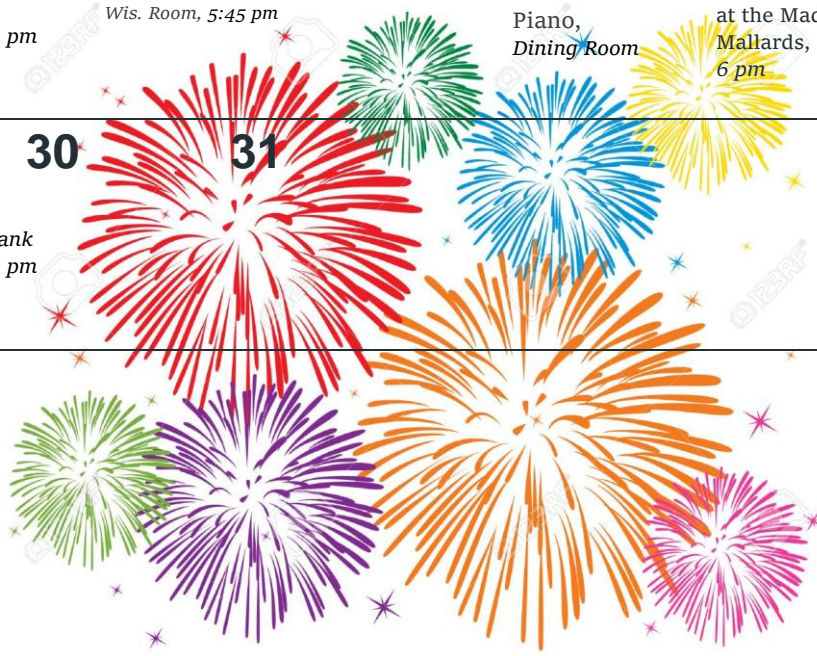
